She's on the "Fragrant Isle" to present "La Bellezza d'Ippolita" at a two-week show of Italian pictures. Then it's on to similar shows in Tokyo and Manila. **Rosanna Schiaffino** is also making the jaunt, and **Claudia Cardinale** expected in Tokyo in March for presentation of "La Ragazza di Bube" . . . Mexican trio "Los Tres Caballeros" due in Italy today for a series of radio and TV appearances. The group is Mexico's most popular, and has toured the U. S. and Latin America already . . . **Rumer Godden's** best-selling "Battle of the Villa Fiorita" will be filmed soon with **Maureen O'Hara** playing the tweedy English lady and **Omar Sharif** (of "Lawrence" fame) as the Latin lover who teaches her to like pasta . . . French dancer **Zizi Jeanmaire** taking her company to the Orient for a tour . . . James Bond creator **Ian Fleming** and his wife vacationing in Jamaica until March 15. Might there be another book in the offing? . . . upcoming Columbia film "Synanon House" will star **James Cagney** and **Sidney Poitier** as two narcotics addicts . . . young director **Tinto Brass**, after two years of uninterrupted work, has finished his film "on all the revolutions in history, from Pancho Villa's to the funeral of Kennedy" . . . **Gianfranco De Bosio**, artistic director of the Teatro Stabile in Turin, has talked with French writer **Jean-Paul Sartre** about rights to produce Sartre's play "Red Gloves" in Italy.
